As a professional school counselor, you will also provide direct services to students and collaborate and partner with other professionals and your community to promote the growth and well-being of students.

A master's degree in school counseling from UNT Dallas offers an excellent foundation to begin your career in counseling in a school setting. Students are admitted with bachelor's degrees in education, psychology, social work and a variety of disciplines as well as a breadth of professional experience. **Teaching experience is no longer required for school counseling certification in Texas.**

#### **CERTIFICATION**
